Wednesday 14th February 2024

Valentines at Fairground Follies

You can't miss this one!! What a great way to spoil your Valentine. Today Join us as



we take you back in time with a visit to the fairgrounds of old. Stopping along the way for morning tea we arrive in Bowral to see this wonderful display. Enjoy The "Happiest Music on Earth "at Fairground Follies, reminisce amongst the greatest collection of self-playing instruments in the Southern Hemisphere. You'll marvel at the sights and sounds of Antique Street Organs, European Dance Hall organs, the Rockin Robot Band, the original Luna Park Organ, the 100-year-old steam Merry Go Round, and the Taj Mahal, one of the world's largest, oldest, most elaborate, self-playing instruments. We finish this informative 2-hour tour with a nostalgic ride on an elaborately carved, 100-year-old Carousel with its stirring and specially chosen Valentines Day music. A late Lunch today will be provided at a nearby club before heading back home on your coach this afternoon.

### Wednesday 6th March 2024 lunter Chydesdales

Today we head North to visit Bulahdelah Clydesdales. Australia's early settlers used Clydesdales for everything. They would plough the fields, pull logs down from the forest, and take the family to church. The Clydesdale was the most valuable part of the early settlers' lives. We see why these magnificent horses are so loved and special. When you walk up to a one tonne animal and ask it to do something, you want to believe it will do just that. As part of this action-packed experience, you'll get to see how they train these gentle giants to do just about anything they want... if they are in a good mood that is. Seats are provided during this 2-hour visit. We then head into one of the clubs in Bulahdelah for a light lunch of sandwiches and cake with tea and coffee before heading back to the coast.

## Sydney Quarantine Station

For over 150 years the Quarantine Station was for many, the beginning of a new life in Australia after making the arduous & lengthy journey from their homelands. Ships suspected of harbouring people infected with contagious diseases such as Spanish Influenza, Smallpox or Bubonic Plague were quarantined here so that these deadly diseases would not reach the general population in Sydney. Ultimately a success story for the growing Sydney population, it did however leave an indelible mark on those that were quarantined; tales of love and loss play out alongside themes of cultural and social change, medical history, and progress as we take a 1-hour tour with a guide this morning. The Wharf Precinct is the most significant place to understand the arrival and daily operations of residents at the Quarantine Station. You'll explore the heritage buildings and discover the stories of migrants through the 19th and 20th centuries. We stay for a light lunch, this includes a sandwich, sweet treat, fruit and tea and coffee before heading back up the highway this afternoon. This trip includes walking around and will not be suitable for the unsteady or walkers, sorry!

# Wednesday 3rd April 2024 William the Fourth and Aussie High Tea

PALMERS EXCLUSIVE - You loved it last year, so we are repeating this again! This Is How Experiences Are Made, nowhere else can you feel you are going back in time. The unique character of William the Fourth inspires all forms of emotion. Enjoy the serenity or soak up the grand vistas of the Newcastle city panorama from the harbour. You know this is not like any other voyage as you sense what life was like for our pioneer forefathers. William the Fourth is an accurate operational replica of Australia's first steam powered ocean-going paddlewheel ship. The replica William the Fourth was constructed as a community 1988 Bi-Centenary Project at Raymond Terrace, at a cost of \$1.5 million. Today we take a two-hour cruise around the Harbour as we enjoy our individually boxed High Tea on board. (This tour requires 30 people to operate)

After an extremely interesting morning we stop over at Warragamba Dam and enjoy a picnic lunch in the park area before returning home.

# Wednesday 8th May 2024

This morning we stop for Morning Tea along the route before visiting The Hunter Wetlands. The Hunter Wetlands Centre is a conservation sanctuary, with over 200 wildlife species identified as visiting the site. This is the perfect nature-based tourism destination to explore, discover and relax and is only 13km from Newcastle central business district. The Hunter Wetlands Centre offers a range of activities for people of all ages ranging from wildlife, walking trails and guided tours, canoeing, dip netting, feeding talks, bird watching, there is also an Animal House and Arts Space. Today we relax and do as you please wandering around or relaxing watching the wildlife. A hot, 2 course Lunch is included at the Wetlands.





Friday 31st May 2024

Once again Vivid comes to Sydney in all its Glory, if you haven't been before, this is your chance to see what it's all about. Daily shows allow you to pat a wombat, cuddle up to a koala, touch a reptile and watch the monkeys and other animals being fed. There is a wide variety of animals including Monkeys, American Alligators, White Lions, Kangaroos, Koalas, Dingoes, Maned Wolf, Meerkats, and Ring-tailed Lemurs! Early Afternoon we then head into the Vineyards for a relaxing lunch, which is included, at one of the wineries close by and maybe even time for an ice cream on the way home.
